He attended Union Theological Seminary, lived in East Harlem and worked on civil rights issues and was office manager of Clergy and Laity Concerned about Vietnam. He is Founding Partner, Chairman & Creator of The Polarity® Map and Principles. He is an avid outdoorsman and intrepid traveler.

His songs don't match the genre of "americana" so much as the genre matches him, sometimes like a poorly-tailored suit: it doesn't quite fit, but looks good nonetheless.
