We will collect for the Nestlings Diaper Bank of West Michigan in Holland, which is a diaper distribution center for many West Michigan agencies, not a location where individuals can come to get a supply of diapers. They accept both cash donations, which they use to buy diapers from the National Diaper Bank Network at reduced cost, and also diapers for infants, toddlers, and adults. They also accept wipes. Nestlings has requested that C3 donate diapers for older babies, sizes 4, 5, and 6. Packages may be open or closed, as diapers are repacked into large lots.

Collection days are November 10 and 17. Contribute in kind or by cash (in an envelope labeled Nestlings Diaper Bank), check to C3 with Nestlings Diaper Bank on the memo line, or see Chase to donate by credit card designated for Nestlings.
